DIVINE SCIENCE CLASSES

On Sunday, January 9, at 9:00 a.m., the winter session of Divine Science classes will offer the following three classes:

Basic Principle of Divine Science Wayne Gatewood, Instructor.

There is no prerequisite to this class. It is open to all.

The Basic Principle of Divine Science class is the foundation on which all the other classes are built. It is during this class that the student's faith in an ever-present Presence is awakened. Practical Instruction in the application of the teaching is given from the very beginning. This class is offered three times during the church year.

Spiritual Psychology Rev. Donna Gatewood, Instructor

Prerequisite: Basic Principle of Divine Science

The class in Spiritual Psychology teaches the student to reason about life from the basis of the omnipresence of God. In our quest for Truth we learn to look beyond the appearance to that which is real and absolute. Spiritual Psychology presents the physical, mental and spiritual aspects of life as an unfolding process leading to the realization of Oneness. The teachings of Jesus are studied as an approach to philosophy, religion, how to live the truth we have attained, and the understanding of cosmic consciousness. Units on prayer, the silence, healing, supply, and death, among others are presented in the class.

Bible Mystery and Bible Meaning – New Testament, Sylvia Anderson, Instructor

Prerequisite: Bible Mystery and Bible Meaning/Old Testament

This class moves the metaphysical study of the Bible into the New Testament. The class emphasizes the awakening of the Spiritual nature in man as told through the birth of the Christ. This one revelation in the consciousness of an individual transforms ordinary man and woman into children of God. In essence, the story of the Bible, when metaphysically understood, is the story of man as he moves from the Adam state to the Christ state.

BOOKSTORE

As I start my tenure as Manager of the Divine Science Bookstore, I would like to express our gratitude to Elan for the wonderful job she has done for the past several years. I would also like to review some books I have found especially valuable:

Fear Not by Martha Smock

The words "fear not" appear in the Bible nearly 80 times. Why do we fear? What do we fear? Are we afraid to be alone, of people, of being unloved, of lack, of a health condition, of our prayers not being answered? Each chapter of Smock's book focuses on a slightly different aspect of fear and provides us with empowering, positive vocabulary to combat those fears, replacing our uncertainties with positive thoughts of confidence, courage, and self-love. By our affirming of the Truth about our own innate, divine nature, the author assures us that we can overcome life's challenges by conquering our fears through faith. Smock shows us how in difficult times, we can meet fearful thinking with words that proclaim life and affirm God as the unfailing Source, the unfailing Supply of our needs. She reminds us that outer conditions cannot, do not, limit God.

The Universe Is Calling by Eric Butterworth

Because it is the Father's good pleasure to give us the Kingdom, the universe is always calling us to our inheritance as sons and daughters of a Most Gracious God. Butterworth addresses prayer and praying. He guides us in understanding what prayer is, how to really pray, and how not to pray amiss. The author cautions us that this book may lead us onto unfamiliar trails but he urges us to go forward in the spirit of adventure. We have no-thing to lose. We stand to gain the experience of Allness through praying aright.

This Thing Called You by Ernest Holmes

We are not the body. We are spiritual beings who can never lose the Divine Spark. We may lack recognition of Its presence but it is always nearer than breathing and closer than hands and feet. We have been created in God's image and likeness and so God's nature is our nature. Holmes tells us that the Author of Life is in and around us--not a God who was, but a God who is. Feeling, thinking, communing with this Life restores us and fills us with light and power. We need not go in search of It because It is always where we are.
